Cheshire Lib Dems call on the Government to "rethink" the cut



cuts to Winter Fuel Payments.

With energy bills set to rise once again this winter. Cheshire West & Chester Liberal Democrats are calling on the Government to reverse it's decision to cut Winter Fuel Payments for local pensioners.

Across the country 11 million pensioners are set to lose their winter fuel payment under the government's plans.

This includes two million that the charity Age UK has said will struggle to afford their energy bills as a result.

In Mid Cheshire, this would be an estimated 14,500 pensioners at risk of losing the £300 payment, which helps with heating bills in the winter.



SEND CHILDREN 'LET DOWN' BY CWAC

Mid Cheshire Spokesperson Jack Price-Harbach attended a protest organised by the CwaC SEND Accountability Group.

Jack spoke to many parents, guardians and carers outside The Portal in Ellesmere Port, who felt exhausted, gaslit and emotionally drained.

By engaging with concerned protesters, Jack learned how families felt they were being let down by the local authority.

Parents spoke about moving to Cheshire West from other parts of the country, with the promise of specialist support such as hydrotherapy and personal home care for children with complex needs. In many instances those promises fell short, with families choosing to move home **AGAIN** to stand a better chance of getting the appropriate action plans in place for their children.

Some parents have spent tens of thousands of pounds each year to care for their children with Autism, ADHD & other special educational needs, whilst others have quit work to offer full time care.



Your Mid Cheshire Lib Dems will continue to campaign for policies to improve the lives of children requiring extra support. We call on the Labour Government to offer free home personal care for vulnerable and disabled people. We are also campaigning for increased multi-year funding settlements for local councils to allow Education, Health & Care plans to be approved within 20 weeks, rather than the current 50 week wait, overseen by a National SEND Children's body to ensure that legal requirements are met.

Never has an incumbent new Government seen their popularity sink so quickly.

Keir Starmer's programme for "change," ahead of a 10% in the energy price cap, means that vulnerable groups continue to face poverty.

The Lib Dems campaigned to scrap the two child benefit cap, but your MP voted against an opposition amendment to scrap it. Andrew Cooper also made the "difficult but necessary" decision to cut Winter Fuel Allowance.

This month, the Chancellor will make her Autumn statement. Rachel Reeves paid a flying visit to Northwich on the campaign trail. Will Cooper have to make more "difficult but necessary" decisions to return the favour? Be assured that your local Lib Dems will scrutinise the Budget thoroughly.

CANCER TREATMENT IN FOCUS



Cancer remains one of your top concerns and your local Lib Dems continue to raise the issue of patients starting their treatment later than promised. In July 2024, **29%** of patients in the Mid Cheshire Foundation Trust area started their cancer treatment later than 62 days after being referred by their GP.

We welcome the assurances from new Health Secretary Wes Streeting that the Leighton Hospital rebuild is to be protected by the spending review.

However, we call on him & the Chancellor to ensure that there will be no delays to the building of the **New** Leighton Hospital programme in the Autumn Statement, now that the first business case to fund its construction has been submitted to the Government.
